#### Simple Knitted Slippers

From Jane North, as promised at the last Guild meeting.

Yarn: worsted weight Needles: #4 dp Gauge: 5 sts./ IN.
These directions make a Med. To LG. Women's size. Change needle size as desired.

FOOT: Cast on 48 sts, evenly distributed, or 12-12-24. 24 sts.will be picked up and knitted for the heel later. (I think there is an alternative cast-on method, on a holder of some sort, that I haven't used but it might make it easier to pick up sts later.) All STS. are stockinette/straight stitch. Use a marker to show where half of total number of stitches lies: half for top of foot, half for bottom. You will need to know where to decrease.

- Knit 2 rows.
- Row 3: K all sts but DEC 1 st (K2 tog) at middle of instep and of bottom of foot. (K 2 tog at sts.# 12 and 13 from beg, and sts 36 and 37) = 46 sts. remain
- R. 4 –15 : Knit.
- R. 16: DEC as R.3 (sts.# 11 and 12, 35 and 36) = 44 sts.
- R. 17-28: Knit.
- R. 29: DEC as R. 16 (sts. #10 and 11 on each side) = 42 sts.
- R. 30-38: Knit.
- R. 39 or desired length: Beg. DEC for toe: Dec 4 sts./ row . \*(K3, SSK, k to within 5sts of marker, k 2 tog, k 3) x 2 = 38 sts.
- R. 40, 42, 44, 46: K all around
- R. 41, 43, 45 and 47: DEC 4 sts. each row at same places a R. 39. = 22 sts. remain.
- R. 48: K all.
- R. 49: K 3, bind off 4, k 6, bind off 4, k 3. Put 7 sts on holder; you will knit the other 7 sts. as Toe Band.

Now: TOE BAND on 7 sts: K rows 1,3,5, P rows 2 and 4. Leave on needle, put 7 sts on holder on 2<sup>nd</sup> needle, weave together. Then sew sides of band to 4 bound-off sts on ea. side.

HEEL: Pick up 24 sts. from beg of foot bottom, and add new 24 sts for foot opening -48 sts. = 24 sts for heel, 24 sts for bottom of foot.

- R.1- 7: knit around.
- R. 8, 10, 12,14, 16: DEC 1 st each side of heel and ankle (5 times total); e.g. K 1, slip 1, PSSO, Knit across, at 3 sts from other side, K 2 tog, K1; repeat on other side. 4 sts dec each row.
- R. 9, 11, 13, 15, 17: Knit all.
- R.18, 19, 20, 21: DEC as above EACH ROW (4 times total) = 12 sts. remain. Weave together, 6 + 6 sts.
